

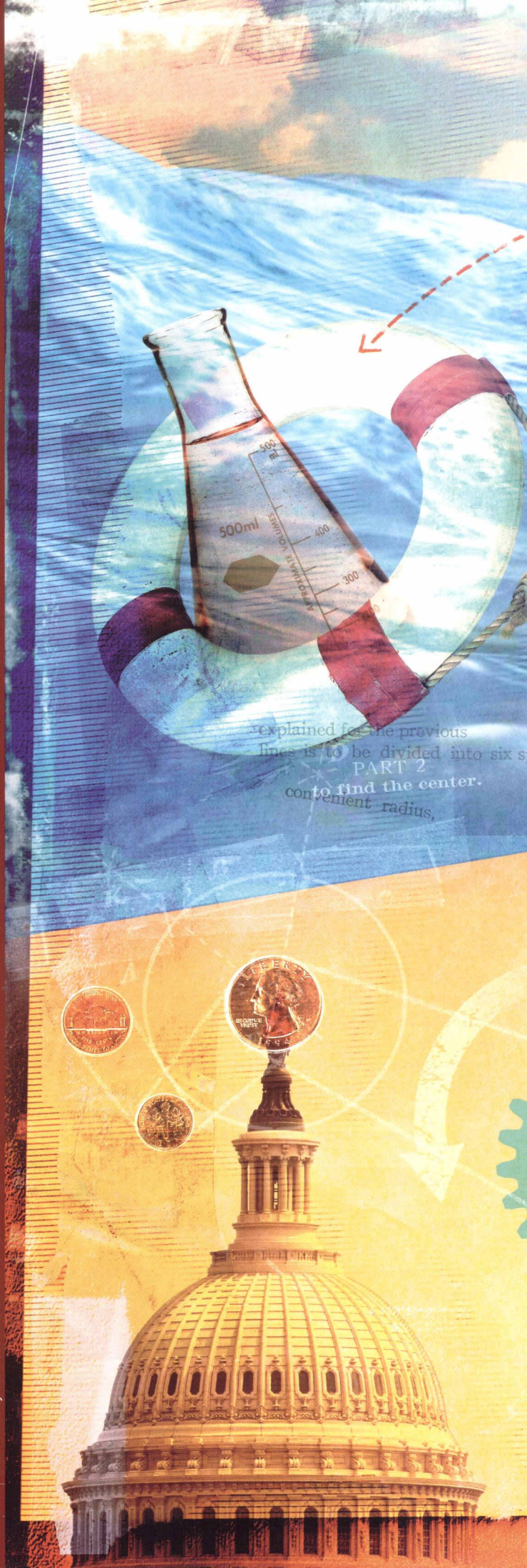
Political Interactions

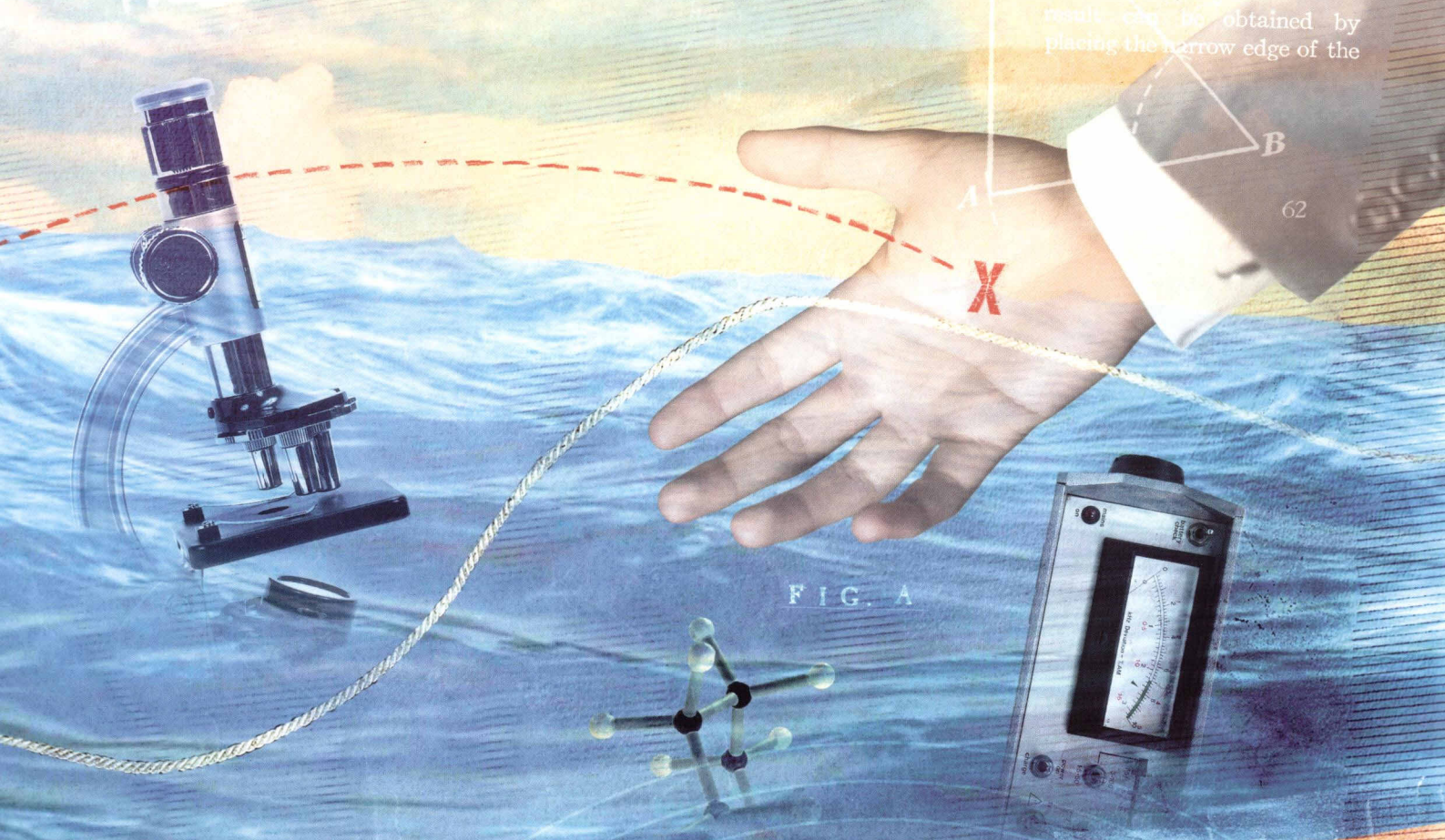
