NEWS OF THE LAW SCHOOL

The Law School was recently advised that the Order of the Coif, national honorary society for scholarship in law, has granted a charter for the establishment of a chapter at the School. The Order has thirty-four other chapters located at leading law schools throughout the country. The installation of the University of Maryland chapter will occur during the coming Spring. It is customary for a school's chapter of the Order to elect to membership, in token of their high scholarship, a small group of the highest ranking students in each graduating class. The Order thus serves as the equivalent in legal education of Phi Beta Kappa in the academic field.

Dean Howell and Messrs. Gump, Reiblich, Reno, and Strahorn of the faculty attended the Thirty-fifth Annual Meeting of the Association of American Law Schools which was held at Chicago, Illinois on December 29, 30, and 31, 1937. At the meeting Dean Howell presented his report as Chairman of the Association's Special Committee on Non-Member Schools, and Professor Reiblich served as a member of the then current Council of the Round Table on Equity.

Several members of the Law School faculty are serving on the various current committees of the Section of Judicial Administration of the American Bar Association. Hon. W. Calvin Chesnut, Lecturer on Federal Procedure, is Chairman of the Committee on Trial Practice, and Charles McHenry Howard, Esq., of the Faculty Council, is member from Maryland of the Associate and Advisory Committee thereof. Associate Professor Herbert M. Brune, Jr., is Maryland member of the Associate and Advisory Committee on Pre-Trial Procedure. Hon. Edwin T. Dickerson, Lecturer on Contracts, is Maryland member of the Associate and Advisory Committee to Suggest Improvements in the Law of Evidence, and Professor John S. Strahorn, Jr., is one of the members at large of the same Committee.

Dean Howell has been appointed one of the Maryland members of the Advisory Committee on Co-Operation between the Law Schools and the Bar of the Section of Legal

Education and Admissions to the Bar of the American Bar Association.

In December Gilbert T. Stephenson, Esq., Director of the Trust Research Department of the Graduate School of Banking of the American Bankers Association addressed the classes in Trusts at the Law School on "The Administration Provisions of Maryland Trust Instruments." Mr. Stephenson's talks at the School were part of the Trust Research Week program then being conducted in Baltimore by the American Bankers Association through the Baltimore Chapter, American Institute of Banking.

The annual Law School banquet will be held at the Chesapeake Club in Baltimore on Saturday evening, April 30. The speaker of the evening will be the Hon. John J. Parker, Chief Judge of the United States Circuit Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit. Emory H. Niles, Esq., of the Baltimore City bar and of the part-time faculty of the Law School will serve as toastmaster.
