## NEWS OF THE LAW SCHOOL

At the Annual Commencement of the University, held at the Fifth Regiment Armory in Baltimore on Saturday, June 4, 1949, a class of 106 was graduated from the Law School. Three of these received the Certificate of Proficiency, and the others received the degree of LL.B. One other degree had also been awarded since the previous Annual Commencement, as of September, 1948.

Two members of the full-time faculty taught during the Summer of 1949 in Summer Sessions of other law schools. Professor Russell R. Reno taught Restitution at the George Washington University Law School, Washington, D. C.; and Professor John S. Strahorn, Jr., taught Evidence at the University of Texas Law School, Austin, Texas.
