## NEWS OF THE LAW SCHOOL

There were 386 students enrolled in the Law School in the Fall of 1954. Of these, 168 were in the Day School and 218 in the Evening School. The entering Day class contained 73 members, and the entering Evening class contained 81 members. There were 93 colleges and universities represented in the pre-legal training of the student body.

A series of weekly lectures and discussions of case material dealing with problems of a medico-legal nature is scheduled for the Spring Term of 1955, pursuant to arrangements made by Professor L. Whiting Farinholt, Jr., of the Law School Faculty.

The series will include lectures by Dr. Jacob E. Fine-singer, Director of the Psychiatric Institute of the Uni-

versity Hospital, Dr. Manfred S. Guttmacher, Chief Medical Officer of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City and Dr. Russell S. Fisher, Chief Medical Examiner of the State of Maryland. Among the subjects to be discussed are the following: Basic Psychiatry as Related to Law; Commitment of the Mentally Ill; Incompetency; Expert Testimony; the Nature and Quality of Medical Evidence; The Psychopathic Offender; Medico-Legal Aspects of Personal Injury Litigation; and Medical Malpractice and Related Problems in the Medico-Legal field.
